# Remembering Maureen Cox

### 8th February 1943 – 19th September 2016



Littleport lost a popular and well-known member of its community in September.

Maureen Cox, much loved mother of Darren and Sam, and beloved wife of District and Parish Councillor Paul Cox, passed away after a short illness bravely born.

Maureen came to live in Littleport from Southery on her marriage to Paul, and soon afterwards they built the house they have lived in ever since.

When their children came along Maureen and Paul made some good friends of other parents, but particularly with Margaret and Barry Constable with whom they shared many activities and even holidays. When Margaret was tragically killed in a car accident in 1980, Maureen drew even closer to Margaret and Barry's children Jason and Sharon.

Having been a full-time mum, when her children were old enough, she went back to work.

Maureen was employed by a tobacco kiosk company, and when Tesco decided to sell cigarettes themselves, rather than use franchised vendors, she was quickly invited to work for them.

Firstly, in the cash office at Newmarket, and then into Customer Services, where

her expertise coupled with her friendly manner, endeared her to colleagues and members of the shopping public alike.

Maureen was always interested in community affairs and supported Paul in his community work, as well as being a part of Littleport's Rotary Club. A keen gardener and lover of orchids, Maureen was a valued member of the Littleport Flower Arranging Club.

Maureen remarkably never took a day off work and was still putting in some hours with no plans of complete retirement.

Her funeral took place on the 4<sup>th</sup> October at the Fenland Crematorium in March, which was packed with her friends and family. Tesco laid on a coach which was over-subscribed and told employees that they could attend that day with no loss of pay.

A reception was held at Littleport Village Hall.

One of the managers at Tesco wrote these words to Maureen's family:

Maureen was a wonderful person and a hugely loved colleague. Lovingly known as 'the Queen of our Service Desk'. She was quite simply one of the greatest characters, friend and colleague that you could ever wish to meet. Always incredibly cheerful and positive, a brief encounter with Maureen would brighten up anybody's day. She was one of life's truly amazing and simply wonderful people.

At her funeral, her son Darren gave a wonderful talk about his family life with his mother, and in conclusion said:

Mum you were simply the dearest, kindest, generous, loving mum anyone could have wished for. Even at the end. positive, hopeful, accepting and scarcely a tear. Rest in peace Mum. Forever in our thoughts.

We are already into the new footie season, and no we are not talking about the elite of the professional world alias Barcelona, Real Madrid, Manchester United and City, Arsenal or Chelsea et al, but none other than our local amateur side Littleport Town FC who everyone should come and support down at the Leisure Centre's playing field.

They are a hard-working and hard tackling side who give their all, and don't command obscene amounts of money like their professional counterparts, but in fact have to keep down a full time job which invariably rules out some of the players not always being available for match days which can often be a managerial nightmare.

Littleport Town's early poor run of league results belies their promising cup form, and according to their Player/Manager Jamie Gayfer, he is very optimistic about the current season.

"We have a great squad and have attracted some good players like former Swavesey midfielder Michael Jordan, 17 year old Harry Walker who has been really impressive, and Liam Heaps who left Ely Crusaders has been of our outstanding players so far.

That isn't to say that we are not on the lookout for new players which we are always on the lookout for," said Town's Player/Manager Jamie, who also puts himself on regular footballing duty which does give Town that extra impetus up front.

Realistically Jamie believes that it wouldn't be a disaster if Littleport Town were to finish mid-table this season, but as the 2016 Creake Charity Shield 2-1 winners over Easton Socon Reserves 2-1 and the Junior Challenge Cup beaten finalists the team believe they have every chance to produce yet another superb cup run which really would make it another season to remember.

We promoted eleven students to the grade of first yellow belt, one to second green, one to first blue, and two to the senior level of second blue. We have been in the village of Littleport less than a year but have been overwhelmed with the enthusiasm of our students and their willingness to learn our unique martial art. Hung Kuen Five Animal Style is an ancient martial art with drills and techniques finely honed

over hundreds of years, focussing on selfdefence and fitness. Our sessions involve training in cardiovascular exercises, strengthening tendon, ligament and muscles, allied to speed, power, agility and flexibility.

## ST GEORGE'S CHURCH



Here at St George's we have begun

discussing how our parish church might be updated internally to make the church building more appropriate for today. This process is a bit complicated, but quite manageable and the result will hopefully be a building fit for the next 100 years (St George's was last reordered in the 1860s so no, nothing of the interior is what we might call original). In case you are thinking it isn't necessary, the wooden floors are becoming dangerously rotten which in itself means wholesale changes, but it is a good opportunity to rethink the other facilities. This would include rehanging the bells which are not usable because of wear in the headstocks.

So, enter 'The Community Audit' - this is the means by which we find out what you, the people of Littleport, would like to see in your parish church. What sort of facilities do you feel would make the church user friendly and versatile; the sort of place where we can enjoy all manner of community activities as well as a good place for formal and informal worship. All you have to do is answer some questions when we see you, and we'll record your comments onto a laptop. There will be an electronic version where you can reply online, and a paper version. So please give some thought to what you would like to see. Meeting rooms? Open space in the main church? What else can you think of?

And speaking of events, a date for your diary is Saturday December 3rd when we will be holding St George's Christmas Market from 10am until 2pm. After the very successful Craft and Art Fair in September, some stall holders will be returning as well as church activities being represented, and weather permitting, the outdoor crockery smash will take place with the team 'seasonally dressed'.

All this talk of community activities for Christmas may sound like we've forgotten why the church was built back in the 1500s and later extended in the 1860s; but we haven't. The church is here because of the Gospel of Jesus Christ who came to this world 2000 years ago. He wasn't born in a fancy palace, but nor was he born somewhere remote away from human society. Christ was born in the middle of the human community, in an inn where else do you find such a melting pot of humanity and its goings on? For some people the Messiah has yet to come; for others a holy God would never come to a world such as this. But the Christian Gospel proclaims that Christ has done exactly that and that he did so right in our midst. I realise that personal circumstances for some mean that Christmas is a difficult time, but please don't forget the message of Christ amongst us, whoever we are. And we look forward to welcoming you at St George's with, or without, its faulty floor!

## A Christmas Message from St John's Methodist Church

My late Mum was a genius at cryptic crosswords and had an extraordinary gift for numbers. I too love word puzzles but alas did not inherit a head for maths, my sister Alison got rather more of those genes I think.

Acrostic poems and puzzles are an ancient literary device in which the first letter of each line spells out a word or phrase. Acrostics were used in the Bible's Old Testament particularly in the Psalms and remain today a useful way of remembering something important.

The most famous acrostic used in the church is ICHTHUS which in greek means 'fish', but also uses the initial letters to spell out 'Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour'.

Below is my own Christmas Acrostic:

Celebrating Christ's birth Hope for the world Reconciliation and peace between peoples and nations Immanuel, God with us

Sharing the Good News of God's love for the world

Thankfulness for family and friends Memories of Christmas past and those we have loved

Anticipation of what the future holds Shining Christ's light in the darkness

Why not have a go at your own acrostic, spelling out what Christmas means to you? Try to think of the positives rather than the negatives, just one word for each is sufficient or be more creative if you prefer.


## The Vine Fellowship "Evidence That Demands A Verdict"

As well as being the title of a book by Josh McDowell, this statement is very relevant for those of us who have been doing the Alpha course at the Vine Community Church. In our second session we learnt from a barrister, Nicky Gumbel, how we can trust the documents that make up the New Testament as reliable accounts of historical events that took place around 2000 years ago. Nicky pointed to sources outside the Bible as well as discussing the gospel texts themselves:

"The first-century Jewish historian Josephus wrote this about Jesus: 'There was about this time Jesus, a doer of wonderful works.' And [Josephus] then goes on to talk about the crucifixion of Jesus and his alleged resurrection."

Nicky then went on to say, "Now, of course, the New Testament was written a long time ago, and people say: 'How do we know that what we have here hasn't been changed over the years?' And the answer is we do know, through a science called 'textual criticism'.

Essentially, the way textual criticism works is like this: the more manuscripts that you have,

Pontius Pilate was the fifth Roman Procurator of Judea, serving in that capacity from 26–36 CE. Sources describe him as a cruel and unsympathetic ruler who was insensitive to Jewish religious feelings. According to the New Testament, he was the one who sentenced Jesus to be crucified. The inscription presented here is the only object from his time that bears his name. It was found reused in the staircase of the Roman theater of Caesarea, the provincial capital; it was probably originally set into a temple built in the city in honor of Emperor Tiberius.

and the earlier they are, the more you can be sure about what the original said."

Nicky pointed out that no one questions the authenticity of these other documents, but none of them match the reliability of the gospels, accounts and letters which make up the New Testament. For example, the earliest copies of manuscripts we have concerning Herodotus and Thucydides, which were written around 488-400 BC are AD 900, some 1300 years after they were written! And we only have 8 copies of each! There are over 24,000 copies of New Testament texts and the earliest date back to AD 130 and were written between AD 40-100!

Last week I came back from a tour of Israel. It was so good to be able to visit the actual places where Jesus was born, was brought up and met people's needs so wonderfully. We are told that He was crucified "under Pontius Pilate". In the past, one of the many things people doubted was if Pontius Pilate even existed at all - until 1961, when this stone was found. I took this photo of it when I was in the museum in Jerusalem. The explanation is above.

With this and a vast amount of other evidence it is wonderful to know that when we put our faith in Christ we truly are trusting in a sure foundation!

## **Greater Littleport & District New Spiritualists' Society**

These three winter months mean different things to different people. In the religious sense, while we as basically Christians enjoy Christmas as a celebration of the birth of Jesus and a new light coming into the world 2,016 years ago, Judaism, the religion Jesus was born into, celebrates the festival of light called Chanukah, that Jesus would have enjoyed too. Jesus who grew up to be a miracle worker must have thrilled as a child to the then 500 year-old story of how the oil in the temple menorah, a 7 branched 'candlestick' symbolising God's presence, had only been enough to light it for a few hours, and yet it burned bright for the whole week. He would have learned how the invading Syrians had placed statues of Greek gods in it 3 years before, and tried to make the Jews worship them, as well as a statue of their king, Antiochus. This was a step too far - and led to a bloody revolt, victory, and the recapture of the temple in Jerusalem. It had then required reconstruction and consecration, and then this miracle occurred. commemorated by Chanukah.

We know that many other belief systems have festivals at this time of year, and we can only just imagine those ancient primitive living conditions and hardships before the advent of modern luxuries like electricity and modern medicine. And many were the superstitions surrounding the seasons of the year, the sun setting and moon rising, with no knowledge of the global shape of our

world or our planetary system, that have given rise to some practices that endure to this day.

Then we have the New Year - again based on the chronology of Jesus's birth, it will turn 2017 six nights later. Jesus would count that as being 5,777 until 9 months after that, when it will become 5,778.

We like to think that our Christian Spiritualist practices are based on respect for others' beliefs, while proving that things we call miracles do still happen. We talk about the miracle of birth, of nature, of the world in which we live and the myriad physical manifestations of God.

St Paul says in his letters to the church in Corinth writing in about 55 AD - or in his calendar, 3,816; 'If there is a natural body there is also a spiritual body. The manifestation of the Spirit is given to men (everyone) for their benefit.' He also states that 'God has given miracles and gifts of healing.'

We practice mediumship/communication with those in spirit, and healing, as part of our religion. All are welcome to come to our meetings in the Village Hall every Thursday evening to hear a short address, followed by a demonstration by guest mediums. Healing is also offered afterwards.

We pray that you and yours have a wonder filled winter season with all good things.



### Music and the Salvation Army



Music forms an integral part of **Salvation Army** worship and evangelism. Bands, songster brigades, youth choirs and

worship groups are an important part of church life and public events.

For many non-Salvationists they are the most recognisable feature of The Salvation Army. Early Salvationist musicians drew upon a rich heritage of British singing and band playing, including contemporary church and temperance bands. Our founder William Booth was keen to distinguish the music of The Salvation Army from other church music, which he considered overly sophisticated.

He issued guidelines to bandsmen and songsters to produce simple songs with an emphasis on strong, clear 'soul-saving' messages. He also believed Salvationists

'must sing good tunes' and didn't 'care much whether you call it secular or sacred. I rather enjoy robbing the devil of his choicest tunes'. For this reason Salvationist musicians moved away from solely using traditional hymns and began to set new words to Victorian songs, such as popular music hall melodies.

Audiences recognised and liked these contemporary songs and so this was an effective way of spreading the Christian message. With brass bands introduced to get people's attention and to make a loud noise when they were preaching on the streets! Today, as well as brass bands (which are still used in some Salvation Army churches) music in a worship service can include choirs (both adult and junior) and more modern worship music using instruments such as guitars, keyboards and drums.

Salvation Army churches always try and reflect their local communities and so a worship service may also include styles from other countries such as an African choir or a steel drum band.





### Littleport & East Cambs. Academy & Highfield Littleport Academy

Residents of Littleport will be aware of the exciting new building project that is going full-steam ahead on the site adjacent to the Littleport Sports Centre. The Active Learning Trust is delighted to be part of the project, which will include a secondary school, a special school, and a brand new sports centre.

The Active Learning Trust already successfully runs 17 schools in Cambridgeshire and Suffolk, including two secondary schools, a special school and 14 primary schools.

The Trust intend to keep the local community updated on progress, and hope to forge strong links in the Littleport area.

Mr Jason Wing and Mr Simon Bainbridge have been appointed as executive heads of Littleport & East Cambs Academy and Highfield Littleport Academy respectively. Both are experienced headteachers who currently run the Neale-Wade Academy in March and Highfield Ely Academy in Ely. They will be leading a team of specialist staff that will deliver high quality education to students across a broad and balanced curriculum.

Highfield Littleport Academy will be the area nominated special school, and will work closely with Highfield Ely Academy (which is also an Active Learning Trust school).

The Trust believe that a school uniform is an important way to give students a sense of belonging and a pride in their appearance. For the first cohort of students - those who join the new schools in September 2017 - the Trust will be funding part of the school uniform free. Blazers, ties and a PE shirt will all be provided. So that students retain a connection to the local community within their new uniform, the school colours of the two primary schools in Littleport will combine in the school tie. navy and sky blue. Other colours will be navy and grey.

It is hoped to arrange a site open morning, so that all members of the local community and interested parties can view site progress and meet key people. This is provisionally scheduled for a Saturday morning in February 2017, but more details will follow.

# Millfield School



This is the first edition of Littleport Life this academic year, and since the last edition we have had the summer holidays and the lovely weather. That all now seems an age away and Christmas is on the horizon.

At the end of September, our Year 6 children had a fantastic experience on their residential visit at PGL in Caythorpe, Lincolnshire. With 3 members of staff, they spent 2 nights away from home taking part in activities such as rifle shooting, abseiling and high ropes.



'Character building' is a term that could be applied to such a visit; but somehow that suggests high levels of anxiety and being forced to do something you really are too scared to do. Yes, going to PGL is an opportunity to try new things, 'push yourself to

the limit'; but nobody is forced to do something they don't want to do and it's also great fun.



This is the first year for a very long time that I haven't joined them, and I felt I was missing out on something quite special. Seeing our children in a different light, seeing them learn new things about themselves and each other, and seeing the sense of satisfaction and pride they feel when they have tried something new or overcome a fear, even if they decide they don't like it and won't ever do that again. For me that's crawling on my hands and knees through dark tunnels!

Family Learning, for parents, has really developed at Millfield this term, which I am really excited about. Last summer we ran a course called 'Keeping up with the Children' which concentrated on Maths. It was so popular that it is being run again for another group of interested parents after half term. In addition, and until Christmas, we have 'Let's Talk' where parents learn about a whole range of different ways to communicate with their children, and then have time to try things out in school.

We have a number of new members of staff who have joined us this year. Nicki Clark, Kate Fulford and Sarah Gower are Teaching Assistants, and Sarah Cort is a reception teacher. In addition we have a new position in school; a Family Support Adviser, and Tara O'Loghlen is now our FSA.

The role is to support families in a whole range of things such as helping get their child to school on time every day, supporting them with how to manage them at home when things might get tricky, visiting them at home to talk about other things that may be of worry and causing stresses in the home such as rent arrears and housing issues.

When we were thinking about the new role we wondered whether we had the need for a full-time position but how wrong we were! I am really proud that we have recognised the pressures that families are under and have thought 'outside of the box' to try to make a difference in our

own small, but quite different way. Already Tara has supported a number of children and their families in very different ways and I know they have really valued this. At a time when a whole range of services are being cut within society, schools need to take risks and step into areas where perhaps they haven't had a role in the past.



And finally, we have a new school prayer, which incorporates the values of The **Elliot Foundation Academies** Trust, slightly tweaked so that all our children can engage with it. We think it works for all of us at whatever stage we are in our lives.

# Littleport Community Primary School Riots!

Yes! This summer in the spirit of commemoration of the people who took to the streets to protest their lot, Littleport Community School pupils re-enacted this important part of their village's history.

Along with other groups, the children in period costume set off from the site of former pub, The Globe. Dozens of angry residents had gathered there for the monthly benevolent club meeting to discuss the hardship being caused by the astronomically rising prices of grain and the prevalent dire poverty that meant people couldn't afford to buy any bread to eat, their staple diet. Despair turned to anger and they spilled out onto the street and went on the rampage, eventually marching to Elv.

The groups - led by trustees of the Adams' Heritage Centre, Grenville



Goodson and councillor Debra Jordan, punched the air and chanted 'bread or blood' as they were guided through the town and shown where many of the rioters lived and worked.



The youngsters were also shown an exhibition inside the Heritage Centre organised by the Field Theatre Group, which detailed the events before, during and after the riots, including the subsequent trials, and terrible sentences meted out and the hanging of William Beamiss, George Crow, John Dennis, Isaac Harley and Thomas South.

Cllr Jordan says that the history of the riots is an important part of Littleport life. She said: "The events we've had here have been brilliant; we've had descendants of some of the rioters come along, even one from New Zealand, It's taken months of research into the court trials and it took about a week to put the exhibition together."

Ten years ago, Sigma was initially run by the Alpaca Lifestyle Farm man himself, Stephen Cole, before he retired, the Ship family then ran it before Kim about three years ago.

The business has continued to progress, thanks in part to the invention of new technology, and since the expansion to larger premises, it has enabled Kim to increase the work force to 4, welcoming Owen Timmins who joined his colleagues Jamie, Janine Darnell and Georgina King in October.

And in the 'Customer Service Award' and the 'Online Business of the Year' Littleport's own Fenland Spirit Services Ltd., were well-deserved finalists.







Peacocks Meadow. What is it? And where is it? You'd be forgiven for asking, because Peacocks Meadow is Littleport's best kept secret.

In 2012 a one hectare are of land behind Parson's Lane was planting with native species woodland trees as part of the Planting Parishes Initiative.

Unfortunately, shortly after the planting had taken place, the main access point from parson's Lane was blocked off by a resident who leased the access strip from the landowner, Sanctuary Housing. Luckily there is another access point in Limes Close car park.

But for four years the young trees languished untended and neglected, while most Littleport residents were unaware of the existence of this potentially lovely public space. In 2015 a Friends of Peacocks Meadow group was formed, to promote awareness of the garden, and to work towards improving the sadly neglected space.

There are plans afoot for many improvements. These include improved access, the creation of a wildlife hedge, woodland bulb planting, and improvements to the drainage and habitat

generally. There is even a plan to create a community herb garden. It is hoped that local schools will begin to use the space as a learning resource.

This autumn, Littleport Rotary donated hundreds of crocus bulbs which have been planted.

But trees don't prune themselves, bulbs don't plant themselves and brambles and weeds stubbornly refuse to clear themselves. This lovely pocket woodland park needs people to lend a helping hand. Why not join our small but enthusiastic band of volunteer gardeners and nature lovers, and help to transform this space into the tranquil oasis it promises to be.

The new year is a great time to make fresh resolutions. If you care about the natural environment and your community, could be your chance to make a real difference.



# Neighbourhood Watch AGM Speakers Sat 22/10/2016

# Neighbourhood Watch isn't busybodies twitching net curtains - it's civic minded people keeping a watch out for the safe-keeping of their neighbours!

Littleport Neighbourhood Watch was represented at the County AGM back in October when Lyn and Cathy Gibb-de Swarte and Kathy Ingram attended.

Chair John Fuller welcomed all those attending at Police HQ Hinchingbrooke Park, Huntingdon.

Police Commissioner Jason Ablewhite gave us his overview – and interestingly told us that Cambridgeshire is considered a low crime region.

Mental Health is becoming a bigger issue and costing most money on the front line with up to 50 hours of police time per day spent supporting people with MH in custody.

Unfortunately he reported that incidences of reported Domestic Violence have rocketed.

Royal protection costs the force a lot because as he pointed out, we have Prince William in Cambridge and Her Majesty the Queen often visits Newmarket to see her horses.

Parkside Police station is the most expensive police premises in UK and only 25% of it is used. There are thoughts of combining Police and Fire premises to reduce costs and improve communication and efficiency.

Police services will focus highly on victims and witnesses in the future.

Volunteer groups such as Neighbourhood Watch, Speed Watch and Countryside Watch are essential and provide valued support to police services. Jason Ablewhite will appoint a full - time officer to oversee all of these voluntary organisations.

The use of tablets while on the beat allows police to save heaps of time.

Reporting of crime continues to be 101 with the addition of AVANTI code word

for NHW. This service is being improved all the time.

Following him, Vicki Skeels, who is Chief Superintendent for the County Constabulary thanked us all for our NHW contribution.

The Chief Superintendent stated that the police force aims to be transparent and open in its operation.

She continued by saying that policing has changed a lot since she joined 28 years ago. It now attracts highly educated graduates, unlike in the 80's when new recruits walked the beat for 2 years. Back then there was little need for body armour or technology. Pubs used to close at 11 and the active part of policing was fending off brawls as people jousted for a taxi home! Car crime was high and domestic abuse took place of course, but was poorly reported.

Armed robberies were common but police themselves were unarmed.

Traffic wardens who used to be attached to the police as civil staff, were kept busy with car towing schemes which were commonplace.

Now the police force has to deal with counter terrorism as a top priority.

Protecting vulnerable groups and focussing on averting risk takes up much of their time. There is a change in crime patterns - crime has reduced, but the demand on resources remains high

owing to safeguarding, sexual abuse cases and cybercrime. There is less car crime and bald tyres but more concern as to who is driving a car and who their passengers are, for instance if a car is stopped for a traffic violation and a 24-year-old male is seen to have two 15-year-old girls in the back...

Cybercrime is so big that officers are needing to be updated on digital policing methods. Fortunately, there are some IT graduates who may be earmarked for more tech policing jobs.

Out of 45,000 calls per year, approximately 7% is domestic abuse, 5% drink related and about 4-5% vulnerable adult/child situations.

There is a high level of forensic input, for example number plate recognition.

If there is a demonstration/protest due, the ethos is 'no surprises' so police will approach the group to intervene before any chance of escalation.

CCTV helps to provide evidence.

PPE has improved to include body armour, batons, and firearms.

Intelligence led policing helps to spot



patterns of crime, for example tracking newly released prisoners.

Financial pressures have led to more collaborative work – police helicopters and dog training takes place with other forces. Police careers appear to be shorter resulting in a transient police force apart from PCSOs who appear to be staying longer.

Future expectations of the Police Force remain unchanged emphasising sensitivity, integrity and respect with collaboration with, and from, the public.

The Chief Superintendent highlighted the new challenges in our neighbourhoods include people trafficking, cybercrime, sexual abuse and terrorism and extremism.

Neighbourhood policing is now focussed on vulnerable groups such as those with mental health issues, the elderly, children, homelessness and engagement with youngsters. Building trust with the local community allows people to develop confidence in the police force and there is evidence with marginalised groups that such encounters help this relationship.

There are 150 PCSOs – a strong investment to continue. Also three mental health experts are aiding the provision for this vulnerable group at times of crisis. Collaboration with ambulance service is aiding the smooth handling of such situations.

Rebecca Tinsley is Cybercrime Security Advisor with the Cambs Constabulary, and gave a talk that covered a lot of ground.

Cyber dependent crimes are those

involving the internet to commit the crime, e.g. fake emails posing as your bank.

Cyber enabled crime can include drug dealing online.

Public Wi-Fi – do not use public Wi-Fi. Pineapple operates as a pretend local Wi-Fi and steals your passwords etc. as you use your computer.

There are 3.4million types of connective devices in the world!

There were 6 million cybercrimes dealt with by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in the last year. You are more likely to be targeted online than offline.

80% cybercrime is preventable by updating anti-virus software and regular software updates, strong passwords and backing up data.

Call Action Fraud for such crimes on 03001232040

After these presentations, the 2016 AGM took place.





An exhibition of photos was on display, the Littleport Society kindly lending their boards. In 1965 a panoramic photo was taken of the teachers and pupils and we managed to name almost everyone on it which gave great interest.

One friend said you didn't need music ( which there wasn't) as the sound of endless talking was a joy to hear. There were approximately 130 pupils and partners at the event. So many memories and such a lot to catch up on.

However a few of us who were in the school

choir did give a little rendition of "Men till the fields of Littleport", a poem set to music by the late Catherine Browning wife of the late headmaster Robert Browning, which was sung by our school choir in the 60s.

The poem was written by Elizabeth Fleming, a lady from Scotland whose brother lived in Wellington Street, Littleport.

We also held a few minutes' silence to think of our school friends who left this life far too soon, and also of our teachers who had passed away.

A small entry fee to cover the cost of the buffet and a raffle with over 50 donated prizes raised £300 for the Poppy Appeal. Janice (Taylor) Butcher, co-organiser, worked extremely hard providing the food and making a very special cake along with helping me to track everyone

down for the event. Susan (Powell) Wilson, Jane (Banyard) & Ben Fisher and Mel Butcher also helped to make the reunion such a successful night.

#### In conclusion Linda (Wilding) Barker tells us:

The Martin School was opened in 1956 and became Littleport Village College in 1972. In 1981 twenty pupils and staff walked the 23 miles to Shire Hall, Cambridge in protest at its closure. As a parent I was one of the eighty who went by coach and two petitions signed by Littleport residents, and parents of the 478 pupils, were handed in. Despite the protests secondary age pupils were transferred to Ely, and the Village College became a community primary school.

The school was later demolished and a new school for infants was built


